## Dean's Message Dr. Raphael Morvant

Our Region VIII Councillor, Dean Jamieson, says of our upcoming Regional Convention (June 23-26) in Salem: "I received my April 2013 The American Organist today, and all of the 2013 regional conventions are listed in it. Our Region VIII's convention certainly ranks as one of the top 2013 regional conventions available." And even a cursory scan of the events listed on the Salem chapter's web sight (http:// agosalem.org) makes this immediately apparent: great talent such as Michael Kleinschmidt, Dr. Jeannine Jordan and Jonas Nordwall—just to name only three of the stellar lineup of organists—alone would make a trip to Salem worthwhile. Add to these an excellent collection of events and programs—some that have never been seen, heard or enjoyed in previous regional conventions—and the Region VIII convention easily lives up to Dr. Jamieson's observation.

Take, as an example, the "Bach and Sons" concert/presentation by Dr. Jordan and her (media-artist) spouse David. This event creates the virtual world of earlier centuries through the use of 21st century technology, by making use of not only visuals, but real-time camera projections of Dr. Jordan's playing. Salem is a great opportunity to submerge oneself in great organ playing, choral and worship experiences and wonderful workshops—and all within driving distance (or, if you prefer, train!). Even room and board costs are being kept reasonable.





The following is the Newsletter Editor's condensation of the requirements for the Service Playing Examination posted in the AGO website. Hopefully this will give each of you an overall concept of the Service Playing Examination. Those of you who are playing on a regular basis at a church would be able to pass this examination. It may take a couple of times but you will eventually accomplish the material. You already possess many of the skills, and the preparation for this examination helps refine those skills. The result is a better worship experience through better service music. The Les Bois Chapter will hold training sessions for those interested in pursuing a certificate. #### **SERVICE PLAYING CERTIFICATION (SPC)**

#### **Overall Concept**

For the organist who can meet the performance requirements of the typical service of worship

- 1. Perform organ literature of modest difficulty
  - 2. Accompany a choral anthem
- 3. Lead and accompany a congregational hymn and a psalm
  - 4. Sight-read a short passage of music on two staves
    - 5. Transpose a hymn, with advance preparation

#### Organ Music

(Must play one from each group)

#### **GROUP A**

Any chorale prelude by Bach
Any fugue by Bach, can be from the so-called "Eight Little Preludes and Fugues"
Any chorale prelude by Buxtehude

#### **GROUP B**

A single movement by Mendelssohn, Vierne or Dupré

#### **GROUP C**

Any one of Schroeder's Six Chorales
Any movement from Langlais's Organ Book
Any piece from Saint Augustine's Organbook by Gerald Near
Any one of Bloch's Six Preludes
Wayne L. Wold: Trio on People, Look East from Light One
Chelsea Chen: II. Moonlight Blue from Taiwanese Suite.

#### Examination Order

(similar to a worship service)

S1 – Prelude from either Group A, B, or C.

S2 – Opening Hymn with two transpositions.

S3 – Psalm accompaniment

S4 – First Anthem Accompaniment

S5 – Middle Hymn – 2 stanzas

S6 – Second Anthem Accompaniment

S7 – Offertory from either Group A, B, or C

S8 – Sight-read a short passage of music.

S9 – Closing Hymn - 2 stanzas

S10 – Postlude from either Group A, B, or C

#### **EXAMINATION DATES**

SERVICE PLAYING CERTIFICATE TEST: October 1, 2013 through April 30, 2014

#### APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Service Playing Certificate Test

Contact National Headquarters for application forms and a manual of procedure after July 1, 2012. The completed application may be submitted between September 1, 2012, and March 1, 2013. Tests may be taken at any chapter where a suitable organ and recording equipment are available, since the tests are recorded and the recordings are sent to National Headquarters for evaluation.

#### TWO REASONS TO BECOME CERTIFIED

- 1. The Guild has provided a ready-made program for you to develop and improve your organ skills. Preparation for the exams strengthens you in areas that you use all the time: sight-reading, transposition, modulation, improvisation, accompaniment, and hymn playing.
- You will be a better organist and a better musician. The preparation will make you more skilled and confident. And the certificate will give you the respect of your employer and your peers, and a justified feeling of accomplishment.
